
This past week in church school students learned about the significance of the visit from the Maji, the holy family's flight to Egypt to escape the killing of the innocents, and Jesus teaching in the temple in Jerusalem.


After Christ's birth, the Maji followed a star to find the newborn King. They brought him gifts fitting of a king: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. This is important because they were the first people outside of the holy family to honor Jesus as Lord.

Students then learned about King Herod's plan to get rid of Jesus.

Herod heard that there was a new King born in Bethlehem, so he ordered his men to kill all of the male children under the age of 2. Because of this an Angel appeared to Joseph and told him to take Jesus and Mary to Egypt to escape from Herod's horrible plan.

After the celebration his family returned to Bethlehem without realizing Jesus had been left behind! 
